

#### **Priority Learners**

If your child is a priority learner this year in Reading, Writing and Maths, teachers will be making contact with parents in early term 1 and will also be working hard with your child in this/these areas to ensure that they make accelerated progress this year. Accelerated progress is making 1 year progress in their target area. Your child may have extra work to complete at home in their target area. Please work with your child to complete the tasks.

#### **Homework**

Homework is not compulsory.

**Te Kakano tamariki** - will be sent home with UFLi homework twice weekly which relates to their literacy learning in class. Please let your child's <u>teacher</u> know if you would not like your child to have homework.

Te Pihinga and Te Mahuri tamariki - Please let your child's teacher know if you would like your child to have homework. Homework will be available every fortnight (on Tuesday). Homework is due on the Friday before the new homework is given, giving the students a week and a half to complete their homework.

If students fail to complete their in-class work the expectation is that they will complete it at home.

#### Seesaw Learning Journal, Reporting and Whanau Interviews

All students at Turaki Primary School have a Seesaw Journal. Your child will be using their own Seesaw journal to show their thinking, explain their work, share their ideas, answer questions and to watch their own progress throughout the year.

Seesaw is used as the prime platform to keep whanau informed of their child's learning. This will provide whanau with 'real time' reporting which will enable you to keep up-to-date with your child's learning throughout the year. Reporting posts across all curriculum areas are posted to Seesaw throughout the year.

General comment and curriculum level reporting are posted to student Seesaw journals twice a year, generally at the end of Term 2 and 4.

We promote parents and caregivers having regular contact with our teachers to touch base and just see how things are going. We have an open door policy which promotes sharing of information.

In the next few weeks, we will work through setting up your child's seesaw journal with them. You will be sent an invite to join your child's Seesaw journal. Seesaw is a great tool for you to see, hear and collaborate with your child through their learning. Having our whanau involved in their child's learning is an awesome tool and we look forward to working with you and your child to make 2025 an awesome year.

#### Whanau Initiated interviews

As well as Real-Time reporting happening throughout the whole school year, your child's teacher will make contact with you each term to set a time to meet with you about your child's learning.

Our whanau interviews are an opportunity for parents and teachers to discuss the student's progress and any learning issues/next steps.

#### Informal interviews/conversations

Whanau are welcome to arrange another time with the class teacher to discuss their child's progress at school. The school may contact parents/caregivers if a student is identified as needing additional support, not achieving or if there are behavioral issues that need addressing.

#### **Term 1 Swimming**

<u>Te Kakano students</u> will have at least 4 swimming sessions per week. Swimming sessions will be held in the school pool. Please ensure your child brings their swimming togs and a towel.

<u>Te Pihinga and Te Mahuri students</u> - please see the swimming timetable included in this booklet. These sessions will be held at the Town Pool.

If your child is NOT swimming, please send a note stating how long they will not be swimming for. If a student does not bring a note on the second time of not swimming, parents will be contacted and a consequence may be given to your child. Swimming is a part of the PE & Health curriculum. It is important that students fully participate in all curriculum areas.

#### Ki Waho - Te Kakano (Year 1-3) Students ONLY

During the school year all Te Kakano students will attend our outdoor classroom located in Manunui. Your child will have the opportunity to learn, play and explore in a forest and farm environment.

Please send your child to school with a change of clothes and a booster seat. Food will be provided. Please ensure that you fill in and return the permission slip before your child's first trip to Ki Waho.

#### Technology - Year 5-8 students ONLY

#### Medical needs at school

If your child has medical needs or specific preferences and is enrolled at Turaki School, please inform us about these requirements. If your child needs medication to be administered during school hours, please visit our office administrators. There, you will be provided with the necessary forms to grant permission for the administration of medication. When bringing in shared kai for special celebrations please check with your child's teacher at least 2 or 3 days prior as we do host a number of students who have allergies and/or medical needs.

#### Some reminders for the beginning of the year:

- All students <u>must</u> wear their Turaki School hat when outside during Term 1 and Term 4. Please leave all other hats at home (Ownership).

- Cell phones are not to be brought to school at anytime. If they are found at school they will be held at school for parents to collect. (Honesty, Ownership).
- Please ensure all non-uniform items are left at home. A signed note from home must be given if a student is out of school uniform (Ownership, Respect, Attitude).

#### TURAKI SCHOOL BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT PROCEDURE 2025

#### MINOR BEHAVIOURS

#### Physical Contact

Examples: Pushing in line, pushing to get through a door, little

#### Inappropriate Talk

Examples: Name Calling, Swearing (Out of frustration, slip of the tongue) calling other students names, threatening, sticky beak

#### Minor Property Misuse

Examples: Scratching of desks, writing on desks, breaking of small property items, technology.

#### Disruption to class

Examples: Calling out, silliness in class, being rude, talking to peers

#### Disrespecting others

#### Lateness

Example: Arriving back in class late.

#### Defiance

Examples: Refusing to do something/work, doing something they have been told not to.

#### Out of Bounds

Examples: Leaving the school grounds during the school day, on stopbank, being in another class or in clas

Provoking Others

#### Mini Chat

3 reminders given to student/s of acceptable behaviour prior to giving a mini chat - e.g. close proximity, verbal, non-verbal/signal, ignore/attend/praise, re-direct, provide choice, conference with student

After 3 reminders (about the same behaviour), students will receive a mini chat.

If there needs to be a consequence, the mini chat can be done in the student's time.

Record each mini chat in the PBIS SWIS App (Referral Type: Minor).

#### **Time Out**

Students will go to **Time Out** if any of these **major** behaviours occur or any behaviour deemed to be unacceptable at Turaki School.

Time out form to be completed by the referring teacher in the PBIS SWIS App (Referral Type: Major).

Time out to be done with the Principal or SLT team. Students call parents/caregivers to inform them of their behaviour. Discuss the behaviour with the student.

> Student to complete a restorative/reflection activity e.g. "I" statement reflection, an apology letter

Time Out form to be sent home with the student, to be returned the following day with Parent's comments/signature.
